

Members of this organization do not join to be recognized at club, zone, district or national levels, but when a member is recognized for their hard work and consistent effort, it is a great feeling, and quite often reignites the spark that the member has for Kin. As the district awards director this year, I want to encourage members to go for awards. Please check out what awards are new for our district, and what is both new and updated on the national level.

Should you need assistance or have a question, please reach out to me.

Purpose of the Awards

Kin Canada's awards and recognition program exists to:

- **Celebrate excellence** among members, clubs, zones, and districts.
- **Encourage leadership and service** within communities.
- **Boost member engagement and retention** by acknowledging contributions.
- **Promote Kin values** of fellowship, service, and personal development.

What is new and exciting this year for District 4?

- **Kin of the Month** – This award will be presented to one Kinette and one Kinsmen every month. That member will receive a \$250.00 donation made to any registered charity in their name. The award nomination link was emailed to all clubs and can also be found on Facebook or by reaching out to me.
- **Kin of the Year** – All winners of the Kin of the Month award will automatically be entered to win the Kin of the Year award. That winner will receive a \$500.00 donation, made to any registered charity in their name.

There are still a few more months available to sponsor

- **The Martin Frigo “Hi Friend” Memorial Individual Service Hour Recognition Award**
 - This award is named in honour of Martin Frigo of the Kinsmen Club of St. Albert. Martin left this world far too early. Loved by all who met him, the loss of this member was felt across the entire District.
 - This award will be awarded to the Kinsmen or Kinette in District 4 who has recorded the most Kin-related service hours between July 1st and March 31st.
 - Deadline: Deputy Governors submit to the awards director 30 days before the District Convention for the year, July 1–March 31st

Purpose

To recognize the individual member with the most Kin service hours recorded between July 1st to March 31st of the current Kin year.

District Four Photography Award

- Due Date: 30 days before District Convention. Award to be presented at District Convention

Purpose

To recognize individual Kin that has excelled at capturing the essence of the Objects of Kin Canada through photography during the past 12 months.

Eligibility

1. Any Kinsmen/Kinette in good standing shall be eligible to participate.
2. Only the photographer has the right to submit a photograph, and the photographer must sign the entry form.
3. To be eligible for this award, the photograph must have been taken within the past Kin year.
4. The photograph must illustrate some aspect of the Objects of Kin Canada

Submission Guidelines:

- The entry must include a 100-word essay outlining how the photograph is related to Kin Canada's Objects.
- Entries must include the Photographer's name and club, where the photo was taken and must also contain a model release notation if the photograph consists of identifiable people. (Ensure that the model/models in the photograph are aware that their picture may be circulated publicly.)
- Printed entries can be mailed to the District Awards Chair and clearly marked as a submission for the District Photography award contest. Digital entries can be emailed to the District Awards Chair.
- The District Photography Award contest runs from July 1 to 30 days before the upcoming District convention of each current Kin year.
- Entries must be received 30 days before the District Convention.
- One entry per person.
- Acceptable printed entries may be in colour or black & white and should be submitted as a minimum 5" x 7" print using photo-quality paper. The original file resolution must be a minimum of 3.1 megapixels (300 dpi). The digital prints should match the quality and character of the original digital capture.
- For all entries, original material, including original negative and/or capture file, must be available for reproduction purposes. All entries and contest material received become the property of the District and will not be returned.

What is New on the National Level

- **PERSONAL AWARDS Maple Leaf Award of Distinction (Tier 1 of 3: Kin Excellence Program)**
 - **NEW:** As of the 2025-26 Kin year, members will be able to obtain their points during their first and second year or during their second and third year. Members will still have only 2 years to achieve the required 300 points. This change does not apply to the one-time only Special Maple Leaf of Distinction Opportunity. **Objectives:**
 - To encourage participation in club activities while becoming familiar with all aspects of the Association
 - To stimulate self-development, improve communication and foster leadership skills within the first three (3) years of being a Kin member (New change from 2 to 3).

Eligibility

1. Open to active members in their first two to three (3) consecutive years of joining Kin (New change from 2 to 3)
2. Must complete 6 out of 7 mandatory requirements
3. Attain a minimum of 300 points in the Optional Requirements section
4. May not sign his/her own affidavit.

Note: Members will be able to obtain their points during their first and second year or during their second and third year. Members will still have only 2 years to achieve the required 300 points.

[Maple Leaf Award of Distinction - Special Opportunity](#)

From now until January 30, 2026, the Maple Leaf Award of Distinction will be open to Kin members who:

- Joined before July 1, 2023
- Have not yet submitted for this award
- This one-time extension allows members who missed the original 2-year eligibility window to apply and continue their path toward the Kin Excellence Program Award.

Why This Matters: We know there are many reasons why members may not have completed the Maple Leaf Award early in their Kin journey. This extension ensures that your hard work and dedication can still be recognized.

What You Need to Know: This opportunity is only available until January 30, 2026

Completing all three awards (Maple Leaf, Founders, Members) earns you the full Kin Excellence Program Award.

How to Participate

- Members and clubs can nominate candidates through official Kin Canada channels.
- Submissions often require affidavits and supporting documentation.
- Awards are presented at the National Convention and district events.


Our summers here are pretty quiet as we shut down, and most members leave for holidays and travel since we're so remote.

Kinettes Christmas hamper campaign seeks home

The St. Albert Kinettes are hoping for a pre-Christmas miracle this month as they search for a home for their annual hamper campaign.

St. Albert Kinette Club fundraising co-ordinator Natasha Lefebvre put out a call for help to the *Gazette* last week to find a space to host the group's 59th annual Christmas Hamper Campaign.

The campaign typically provides about 300 St. Albert families a year with a hamper packed with Christmas dinner, gifts, and up to four weeks of food, although scarce donations last year meant families got about five days of food instead.

"We really know people are struggling this year," Lefebvre said, so the group hopes to raise enough donations in the coming months to give families the full four weeks of food.

But the club also needs a place to store, sort, and assemble all those hampers, and right now it doesn't have one. Lefebvre said the club would usually have a donated space by now, but this year none of its usual locations were available.

"I'm really hoping there is some angel who will read this article and will be able to help us out with a space," she said — ideally by mid-October.

Lefebvre said the club needs 7,500 to 10,000 of square feet of space with washrooms and heating from Nov. 14-19 to assemble and distribute its hampers. Ideally, this space would be in St. Albert to better work with St. Albert Transit's fill-a-bus efforts in support of the campaign.

Lefebvre said renting such as space would use up almost all the club's donations and leave families with maybe a day's worth of food in their hampers.

"I honestly don't even know if we would be able to afford it," she said.

Lefebvre said anyone who donated this space would get a gift-in-kind tax

receipt and public thanks from the club.

Even if the club doesn't find a space for the hamper drive, Lefebvre said the club would find a way to make it happen, even if that meant running it out of their own homes.

"This has been my Christmas for the past 15-to-20 years. There's no possible way it won't happen."
